Number 2

It would be difficult to imagine modern life without computers.

It was in 1833 that a man named Charles Babbage invented all the parts that are now used in modern computers. It was just over 100 years later when a man named Konrad Zuse invented the Z1, the first modern computer, in 1936. He went on to invent the Z2, an electro-mechanical computer, in 1939. By the next decade, people developed computers that were the size of a large room. Computers like the ones we have in our homes today started being made in the 1980s and three modern computer makers – Apple, HP, and Microsoft – all started out in car garages.

We now use computers for nearly everything and they are everywhere around us. There are over two billion computers in the world right now. Globally, we send nearly 281 billion emails every day. In the United States more than 80% of daily emails are Spam – another word for junk email. Google, the online search engine, processes 70,000 search questions every second. We keep over 90% of the world's money on computers and computers help the post offices separate almost 95% of their mail.

Yes, it definitely would be difficult to imagine modern life without computers.
