His plants grew nicely this year, and the only thing the earth needed before the harvest* season was some rain. One morning, Lencho looked at the sky from his window and prayed to God.

“①[],” Lencho said to his wife, who was preparing lunch.

“How do you know?” she asked.

“God will surely help us because I prayed,” replied Lencho.

The older children were working on the farm, while the smaller ones were playing near the house, until the wife called to them all.

“Come for lunch.”

During the meal, just as Lencho had told his wife, dark clouds covered the sky, and big drops of rain began to fall. The air was fresh and sweet. Lencho went outside to feel the rain on his body. When he returned to his house, he said proudly, “Those aren’t raindrops falling from the sky. They are silver coins. The big drops are ten-cent coins and the little ones are fives....”

Lencho was very happy now as he knew that he was able to make a lot of money by selling his corn and beans.

Then, suddenly, a strong wind began to blow, and very large hailstones* began to fall. These truly looked like silver coins.

“It’s really getting bad now,” shouted Lencho, “I hope it stops quickly.”

But it did not. For an hour, the hailstones fell on the house and the farm. The farm was white. It looked like it was covered with salt. Not a single leaf remained on the trees. The corn was totally destroyed. The flowers were gone from the bean plants. Lencho’s heart was filled with sadness. When the storm passed, he stood in the middle of the farm and said to his children, “Look, the hailstorm has left nothing. This year, we will have no corn or beans. We worked hard for nothing! We are all going to ②starve.” That night, Lencho couldn’t go to sleep. With his heavy heart, he was thinking to himself, ‘We are in great trouble. There is nothing we can do, and no one can help us.’

Then, Lencho’s face suddenly brightened as he found a hope, a single hope, which would save him and his family. His only hope was help from God.

Even though Lencho was a simple farmer, he still knew how to write. The next morning, he began to write a letter. It was a letter to God.

‘God,’ he wrote, ‘I lost all of my corn and bean plants because of the terrible hailstorm. If you don’t help me, my family and I will go hungry this year. I need a hundred pesos* in order to buy new seeds for my farm and to be able to eat until my corn and beans grow again.’

He wrote ‘To God’ on the envelope, put the letter inside and went to town. At the post office, he placed a stamp on the envelope and dropped it into the mailbox. One of the postmen in the post office found Lencho’s letter and started laughing. He brought the letter to his boss and said, “I have never delivered a letter to God in my life!”

The boss, who was a big, kind-hearted man, also started laughing, but quickly he turned serious and said, “What faith*! I have never met a man who has more faith in God

than the man who wrote this letter. We should not ③[] this man by telling him that his letter cannot be delivered. Oh, I have just come up with a great idea. Why don't we write a letter from God and deliver it to him?"

However, when the boss opened the envelope and read the letter, he realized that ④he needed something more than ink and paper.

"Shall we just tell the man that the letter cannot be delivered?" asked the postman.

"Wait, we can still collect some money and help the man," answered the boss.

The boss asked all the workers in the post office to give a little money for an act of kindness, and he himself donated a large amount of money from his salary. However, it was impossible for him to gather a hundred pesos. He was able to give the farmer only a little more than half. He put the money in the envelope together with a letter saying, 'From ⑤[].'

The following Sunday, Lencho came early in the morning to ask if there was a letter for him. The postman handed the letter to Lencho. The boss was watching them from the doorway of his office with a big smile on his face as he imagined Lencho's reaction. Lencho didn't show any surprise when he opened the envelope, but his face turned red when he counted the money.

"God cannot make any mistakes!" he shouted.

Quickly, Lencho went up to the counter to ask for ink and paper. On the public writing table, he started to write a letter. 6 次の英文を読んで、後の問1～8に答えなさい。

Corals* are dying worldwide because of rising sea temperatures. As corals die, the sea creatures who live around them move on. Now scientists have found an unusual way to get fish back – setting up ①[] in the ocean.

(ア) As the temperatures of the world’s oceans have increased in recent years, corals around the world have begun to die off. This is often called “coral bleaching” because sometimes the dying corals turn white.

(イ) These large living collections attract and support many other sea creatures. So ②when corals die off, it’s not just about the corals. The creatures that live in and around them may also lose their habitats. The richness of all these different kinds of animals in the same place is very important to the health of oceans.

(ウ) Scientists from the UK and Australia were curious about how important sound was for making fish come to coral reefs*. They wanted to see if they could ③lure fish to an area with dead corals by playing back recorded sounds from a healthy coral reef. Scientists call this method “acoustic enrichment” – making an area richer in sound. The scientists have recently published their results in the magazine *Nature*.

(エ) Many people think of the underwater world as silent. ④[], that’s not actually true. There are many different kinds of animals, and they make an interesting mixture of sounds as they go about their daily lives.

The scientists decided to test their idea at the Great Barrier Reef. That’s the world’s largest coral reef and home to many sea animals. But it’s also seriously threatened* by the warming waters caused by climate change.

The scientists set up piles of dead corals in three different places around the Great Barrier Reef. At the first location, they did nothing. At the second one, they put underwater loudspeakers but didn’t play anything through the loudspeakers. Around the final site, they placed underwater loudspeakers and played recordings of sounds from a healthy reef every night. The scientists did the experiment for six weeks. At the end of those six weeks, ⑤the scientists found that the noisy site [1] [2] [3] many fish as the [4] sites. This site also had 50% more different kinds of fish. The fish that came to the noisy site came faster and they stayed longer.

The scientists believe their experiment shows that acoustic enrichment is one possible way to get sea life to come back to areas where coral reefs have been damaged. The scientists point out that ⑥their method doesn’t make the coral reefs healthy again. But attracting more fish may be helpful to cure damaged reefs.
